Decide on your topic – any aspect of the current theme

'Challenges and Chances in the English-Speaking world' is possible (**political**

developments: populist positions versus democratic liberties?; news and media: social media as a political platform, fake news, media literacy; **environmental matters:** causes of climate change (e.g. greenhouse effect, mining, food production, mobility); responses to climate change (e.g. renewable energy and green technology, plastic ban, CO₂ trade, reconsidering consumption, grassroots movements, political initiatives, denial).

Confirm your character and your outline with your class teacher before you actually start writing.

Finish your story on the final page starting like this 'And the moral of the story is...' - refer to your course studies giving evidence for your story.

Hand in your finished work until Friday 11th March (preferably digitally).

How will your work be graded:

Content:	Which character did you choose / invent? What does your character have to do with our course studies? Does your story have a sensible thread? Does your story make sense? What is the moral of your story —> reference to your course studies / current developments
Language:	structure of text /coherent; precise and idiomatic choice of words; use of connectives; sentence structure (e.g. gerunds / infinitive constructions); linguistic correctness; general amount of errors
Design / Layout:	choice of pictures / drawings —> do these fit to your storyline; colour concept; font
